



MBAS MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. To become a member of the MBAS or to be a Coach you are required to:
 - You must take the Masters Community Coach Clinic and have completed the Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders (RIS) module within 60 days of completing the course. **Please note: You will be required to have an NCCP# before you can complete this module.** Your NCCP# will be emailed to you once the clinic has been registered into the Coach Canada Locker Database. You may coach following this course however; you must complete the Respect in Sport (RIS) module within 60 days. **After 60 days** you will not be eligible to coach until this is completed.
 - **If working with children, a Vulnerable Sectors Check must be completed and a copy sent to the Bowling Federation of Saskatchewan. (300 – 1734 Elphinstone St, Regina, SK S4T 1K1)**
 - Starting with the 2019-20 season, the Commit to Kids online training will be available to those who wish to complete it at a cost of \$12. You will be required to have an NCCP# before you can complete this module.

Coaching Requirements for becoming a Certified Competitive Coach:

- There is a **minimum requirement of 6 months** of active coaching following completion of the Community Coach Clinic **prior** to taking the Introduction to Competitive Certified Coaching Course.
 - There is a minimum of 3 months between taking Introduction to Competitive Certified Coaching Course **and** being evaluated.
 - Individuals also must have taken the MED portion for Competitive Coaches through the Coaches Locker
 - Individuals must be evaluated and the evaluation paperwork must be received by the Clinic Coordinator who submits it to C5 a minimum of 30 days prior to any Provincial or National levelled event.
 - To coach at either the Provincial or National levels for individuals must be a Competitive Certified Coach.
2. To be a member of the MBAS you must register in one of the following categories:
 - **Associate (\$20/yr.)** – Allows you to participate in all Master/YBC Events
 - **Regular Member (\$105/yr.)** – Allows you to participate in all sanctioned MBAS events including, Master/YBC events, participate in National contingent tournaments, and/or coach at MBAC Provincial/National events
 - **Senior Member (\$105/yr.)** – Allows you to participate in all sanctioned MBAS events including, Master/YBC events, participate in National contingent tournaments, and/or coach at MBAC National events. Must be 50+ years.
 3. To be eligible for Provincial Tournaments or to qualify for the National Team you must:
 - Submit tournament entry and tournament fee by the deadline date.
 - Submit an annual membership renewal form together with the membership renewal fee to the Membership Co-ordinator.
 - Participate in one or more of the events sanctioned by the MBAS such as,

MASTER BOWLERS ASSOCIATION OF SASKATCHEWAN
(Affiliated Member of the Canadian Five-Pin Association)



Master/YBC tournaments, mentorship leagues, youth tournaments, Bowling School

- If unable to participate in one of the sanctioned events listed above, you must pay a \$25 fee at the first tournament to be eligible for a National team.
 - A \$65 participation fee is required for all members participating in National qualifying tournaments. **This fee must be paid by the first tournament weekend.** This is a separate cheque made payable to the MBAS and sent to the membership Co-ordinator.
 - It is the responsibility of the bowler to contact their zone representative to find out when their Master/YBC events are being held or to obtain information regarding any of the additional sanctioned events.
4. The National Contingent consists of representatives from the following three (3) Divisions: Tournament Division, Teaching Division & Senior Divisions
- Tournament Division - Consists of four 8 – Game blocks using a Scratch (total pin fall) format. Using this format the top male and top female will be the Tournament Division Singles representatives at Nationals. Using the total pin fall of the best 3 of the four blocks, the top 5 men will form the Tournament Men's Team and the top 5 women will form the Tournament Ladies team.
 - Teaching Division - Consists of four 8 – Game blocks using a POA (total pins over average) format. Using this format the top male and top female will be the Teaching Division Singles representatives at Nationals. Using the total pin fall of the best 3 of the four blocks, the top 5 men will form the Teaching Men's Team and the top 5 women will form the Teaching Ladies team.
 - Seniors Division - Consists of four 8 – Game blocks using a POA (total pins over average) format. Using the total pin fall of the best 3 of the four blocks, the top 2 men and the top 2 women plus the next highest man or woman will form the Senior team.

****Note:** Upon being selected for the National contingent, any and all monies due (including member and guest assessments) are to be paid in full at the Provincial practise.
